Opening Keynote Speaker: Mackenzie Phillips



Mackenzie Phillips – American Actress and author of the courageous New York Times bestselling memoir *High on Arrival*, and her equally successful book, *Hopeful Healing: Essays on Managing Recovery and Surviving Addiction*, is also currently enjoying her role as ‘Barb’ in Season 6 / Netflix, *Orange Is The New Black* and another Netflix show reuniting with series creator Norman Lear for the revival of *One Day At A Time*.

Phillips rose to fame with breakout parts in 1973’s *American Graffiti* and ’70s sitcom *One Day at a Time* and is now making a different impact as a director at the *Breathe Life Healing Center* in Los Angeles where she specializes in trauma, drug, and alcohol treatment and recovery.

The daughter of The Mamas and the Papas lead singer John Phillips, Mackenzie a survivor of substance abuse and a visible and outspoken advocate for addiction awareness and education who brings her knowledge and voice on the subject of recovery and shares her experiences for those who are trying to overcome addiction.

Featured Thursday Motivational Speaker: Tiffany Jenkins!

Tiffany Jenkins is in recovery, a comedian, and social media star behind *Juggling the Jenkins*. Jenkins creates hysterically honest content about motherhood, her experience with opioid addiction, recovery, marriage, and life. She has completed a 40 city-wide speaking tour where she speaks about addiction, recovery, and her struggles with depression and anxiety. She has spoken in jails, at high schools, recovery events, and more, and her YouTube channel and Facebook page have almost four million followers combined.



Jenkins uses her platform to help and inspire others who are struggling with motherhood, mental health, addiction, and those who just need a good laugh.

In her memoir, *High Achiever: The Incredible True Story of One Addict’s Double Life*, Tiffany Jenkins provides an up-close portrait of the face of addiction and the devastating effects of narcotics. The book takes readers inside the distress of addiction by detailing her life in addiction, her time spent in jail, and her eventual recovery and subsequent journey into motherhood. By combining captivating honesty with her signature humor, Jenkins puts a human face on the opioid crisis.

Opening Speaker: Dr. Fred Rottnek—Overdose, Trauma, Drugs, and Behavior: What are We Learning in the Age of Fentanyl?



Fentanyl is frightening. And it has made its way across the Midwest. We have learned much about the effect of opioid use and misuse on brain chemistry and structure, and many of these changes are similar to the effect of trauma on the brain. In this session, Dr. Fred Rottnek, Program Director of Saint Louis University’s Addiction Medicine Fellowship, will discuss the current science of opioids, the brain, and behavior. What do we know and what are we learning about the intersection of trauma and opioids? What is fact and what is fiction about fentanyl and other high-potency opioids? And how can we examine our program processes to assess their relevance in the current age of fentanyl?

Fred Rottnek, MD, MAHCM is a Professor and the Director of Community Medicine at Saint Louis University School of Medicine and the Program Director of the Addiction Medicine Fellowship. He teaches in the School of Medicine, the Physician Assistant Program, the Center for Interprofessional Education and Research, and the School of Law. Board-Certified in Family Medicine and Addiction Medicine, he is the Medical Director for the Assisted Recovery Centers of American (ARCA) and the St. Louis City Juvenile Detention Facility. He serves on the boards of the Saint Louis Regional Health Commission, the ARCHway Institute, and Alive and Well Communities.

Featured Closing Speaker: Wesley Geer!

Wesley Geer has been a professional musician for over 20 years. He first found success as the founding member of Jive Records artist Hed P.E. as guitarist, songwriter and producer. After touring the world for eight years, Wes left the band for a lifestyle change and ultimately landed in rehab. Then in 2010, at almost three years sober, he was approached to play with the legendary band Korn. He joined Korn and worked with them as their touring guitarist for the next several years, traveling to 42 countries, headlining shows, playing to crowds of 80,000 people, and appearing on a number of recordings and cable and TV shows. His music has been featured in many feature films, video games, radio, and television shows.

Wes also has long had a passion for teaching music. Previously a music teacher at The Fusion Academy’s Huntington Beach campus, Wes taught Recording Arts, Drums, and Guitar.

“I’ve always had a desire to teach and help people through music. It was while teaching at Fusion Academy, that I really realized the level of engagement the students would have when we were ‘writing a song’ together, and then record it! It gave such a greater sense of purpose to our music, and a greater connection between us.

But it was when I was in treatment that I realized how much music could help [me] get through those tough emotions that run so rampant, especially in the early days. Being totally sober and dealing with the bottom I had hit -strumming the guitar was the only thing that would bring me peace. Everyone would wait in line for their turn to play, even people who had never played guitar.”

These ingredients really helped me realize this combination had the potential to be a powerful tool within the recovery community. When I looked around, music seemed to be missing from the treatment curriculum. It became my dream to create a music program that could help all those in need. . . . And so began Rock to Recovery.”

AMSR Training is designed to enhance your skills in the recognition, assessment, and management of suicide risk. You'll learn about the delivery of effective suicide-specific interventions and how to develop collaborative treatment and safety plans with those at risk for suicide.

You can ask questions, practice using the risk formulation, and receive feedback to improve your skills. You'll engage with the AMSR trainer as well as other participants for practice and skill development. We'll provide you with an AMSR manual, so you can take with you the information, background, and tips that are covered in the session.

AMSR-trained professionals report increased willingness, confidence, and clarity in working with clients and patients at risk of suicide.
